COURSE DELIVERY

Online (ONL) courses are completed asynchronously, with 100% of the coursework online. Hybrid (HYB) courses include synchronous or asynchronous coursework and scheduled lab or clinical experiences. Face-to-face (F2F) courses meet in the classroom, lab, and/or clinical setting, with course components provided online in the Blackboard Learning Management System.

BENEFITS OF ADVANCED STANDING FOR MILITARY MEDIC

- Qualified students will receive five credits of advanced standing (AS) for military training. Three additional credits are awarded upon successful completion of lab exam for Health Assessment Across the Lifespan prior to beginning the program.
- Assistance navigating student-related GI Bill, VA, and other service benefits.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

To meet the minimum Military/Reservist, the applicant will be required to have:

- Served in select military classifications: Army medics, Navy hospital corpsmen, Air Force flight medics, and other military medical specialists regardless of branch of service.
- Been discharged in the last two (2) years or within five (5) years for those who have been employed in a civilian health care role.
- Completed a minimum of two years of experience in a military medical specialist role or civilian equivalent
- Minimum GPA of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale
- Completion of all required prerequisite general education courses with a “C” (2.0) or above

TRANSFERABLE COURSES

Trinity College maintains cooperative agreements with Black Hawk College, Eastern Iowa Community Colleges, and Portage Learning. Admission representatives will unofficially review transfer credit for applicants during the pre-application process. Upon receipt of the application, the Registrar will formally evaluate the student transcript to approve transfer credit.
