ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- A baccalaureate or higher degree in a non-nursing discipline OR two years of healthcare experience
- Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN) who hold a current unencumbered license are eligible to receive advanced standing credit for NUR 330 and NUR 332 upon successful completion of the NLN Nursing Acceleration Challenge Examination: Foundations of Nursing Exam, prior to the first semester of the curriculum.
- Minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Completion of all required prerequisite general education courses with a “C” (2.0) or above
 - Anatomy and Physiology I with lab-4 credits
 - Anatomy and Physiology II with lab-4 credits
 - Human Growth and Development-3 credits
 - Medical Terminology-2 or 3 credits
 - Microbiology with lab-4 credits
 - Nutrition-3 credits
 - Statistics-3 credits
- Applicants who do not hold a bachelor’s degree prior to beginning the nursing program must also have completed the following courses prior to the first semester of the program:
 - Anthropology-3 credits
 - College Algebra-3 credits
 - English Composition I-3 credits
 - English Composition II-3 credits
 - Ethics-3 credits
 - Humanities-3 credits
 - Oral Communication-3 credits
 - Psychology-3 credits
 - Sociology-3 credits

TRANSFERABLE COURSES
